Q. You shot your lowest round on Tour yesterday, and followed it up with another great one.

A. Yeah, today was just as good. When I saw I was three or shots clear after the turn there were a few nerves, but I handled myself really well and managed to pick up a couple of birdies coming in.

Q. Your putting was particularly impressive...

A. Yeah I've been working on my alignment for the past couple of weeks, and it definitely seems to be paying off. It's made a big difference, and my putts are rolling really nicely now.

Q. Do you enjoy having such a big lead?

A. Of course, it's why we play the game, to get ourselves in front and in with a chance of winning big tournaments. I'd like to be even further ahead if I could, but I'll settle for three tonight.

Q. What goals have you set for yourself this season?

A. After winning at home my next aim was to win a tournament overseas, so it's great to have the chance to tick that one off the list so soon. Then looking further ahead, getting into the top 100 in the World Ranking is a realistic aim.

Q. A lot of Europeans find it difficult to cope with the conditions here, both the heat and the grass, are you more comfortable?

A. I played on the Asian Tour for two years, so I'm pretty used to it by now. Chipping is very difficult, some of the lies you get are very different to courses in Europe and even back home in Australia. So that takes a bit of getting used to, but I think I'm getting there.

Q. A few of your fellow Australians have said you've got an old head on young shoulders, would you agree with that?

A. I guess so. I've developed quite quickly over the past couple of years, and the other Australians on the Tour have really helped in that respect. They've taught me a lot of the dos and don'ts, and I've taken them on board.
